GENERAL RULES OF THE SHOW

1. **AUTHORITY** – The show will be governed by the standard rules and regulations of the American Rose Society (ARS). Any questions regarding the Rose Show not covered by ARS standards will be resolved by the Rose Show Chairman.
2. **EXHIBITORS** – All exhibitors must be registered for this convention. Exhibitors may submit entries only from their own private outdoor rose garden, except as designated in the Artistic Division. Two people who jointly maintain a garden may exhibit jointly, but **not** individually from the same garden in the same class.

The Novice classes (Horticulture 40 and 41) are open only to exhibitors who have never won a First Place ribbon in an ARS accredited rose show. Judges working this show may exhibit only in Judges Challenge Classes 14 and 28 in the Horticulture Division and Classes 27 and 28 in the Artistic Division .

The following classes are open **only** to current ARS members who reside in the South Central District.

Class 1 - J. Horace McFarland District Trophy
Class 17 - Ralph S. Moore District Trophy
Classes 1 thru 4 in the Artistic Division

The following class is open **only** to SCD members – those rosarians residing within the geographical boundaries of the South Central District.

Class 11 – Oklahoma Challenge

3. **ENTRY TAGS** - Each entry must be accompanied by an appropriate ARS entry tag. All parts of the entry tag must be completed and the Exhibitor's number will be their registration number.
4. **ROSE CLASSIFICATION** – Except for entries in the Hybridizer Challenge Class, roses entered in this show must be listed in a recent edition of one of the following publications: *ARS Modern Roses*, *ARS Magazine*, *ARS Official List of Exhibition Names for Judges & Exhibitors*, *ARS Handbook for Selecting Roses or Combined Rose List*, registration pages on the ARS website. In case of conflict, the ARS publication will be the final authority source. Responsibility for proper identification and classification lies totally with the exhibitor.
5. **HOURS** – Exhibitors may, if desired, store their roses in room 144 (crafts room) at the Senior Center from 6 PM and 7:30 PM on Fri-

day , October 21. Although no refrigeration is available, this room will be air conditioned. The exhibition preparation areas will open at 5 AM on Saturday October 22. Challenge Class and Artistic Placement areas will open at 5:00 a.m. Horticulture entries will ONLY be accepted between 7:30 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. Entries will close promptly at 9:30 a.m. so that the show may be prepared for judging at 10:00 a.m. Registration will be available at the Senior Center on Saturday October 22 from 7:00 to 10:30 AM. Exhibitors must have their personal belongings removed from the exhibition preparation areas by 10:00 AM.

6. **PLACEMENT** – All horticulture specimens will be placed in the show area by the Placement Committee. Only exhibitors placing arrangements or horticulture challenge class entries are permitted in the show area during entry. Exhibitors must leave the show area immediately after their entry is placed to their satisfaction. Exhibitors placing entries in the horticulture challenge classes should remain in the preparation room until 9:30 a.m. in the event their entry has to be moved.
7. **JUDGING** - Judging will be in accordance with the appropriate ARS publications. In horticulture classes each variety shall be judged as a separate class. During judging only judges, and show committee personnel identified by badges, are permitted in the show area. Decisions of the judges are final.
8. **SOUTH CENTRAL DISTRICT TROPHIES** – SCD trophies will be awarded only to First Place winners. Exhibitors winning SCD McFarland and Moore trophies must sign a register for trophies and must arrange to return them to the District Awards Chairman prior to the next District Rose Show.
10. **DISMANTLING** – No entry, ribbon or award may be removed from the show area before the close of the show at 3:45 p.m. Saturday, except by direction of the Rose Show Chairman. All roses entered in the horticulture classes become the property of the SCD Show Committee..
11. **AWARDS PICK UP** – All awards will be packaged and distributed by the Show Committee personnel. Exhibitors may pick up their awards at the awards banquet Saturday evening. Exhibitors are responsible for claiming their awards in person or by their designated representative.
12. **DISCLAIMER** – Your participation as an exhibitor is welcome. All care will be given to safeguard your exhibits. Neither the Dallas

Rose Society, the Fort Worth Rose Society, the SCD, the ARS, the City of Farmer's Branch, nor the Holiday Inn Express Hotel will be responsible for the loss of, or damage to, entries or property, nor for injuries to persons. **Liability of any nature is hereby disclaimed.**

HORTICULTURE RULES

CONTAINERS – Uniform containers for cut specimens will be furnished by the Show Committee for all horticulture challenge classes with the exception of the Old Garden Rose Bouquet, Class 6.

WEDGING MATERIAL – Only aluminum foil or styrofoam wedges, provided by the exhibitor, may be used to position a stem in a single specimen container. Material should not extend above the top of the container.

CHALLENGE CLASS ENTRY TAG – The challenge class entry tag must be used for a collection of multiple varieties displayed in a single container or box, with all the varieties listed on the same tag. For collections in multiple separate containers, each container must be labeled with an individual entry tag.

CHALLENGE CLASS PLACEMENT – Challenge class collections must be placed by the exhibitor. Exhibitors entering challenge classes should remain in the preparation room until 9:30 a.m. in the event their entry has to be moved.

CHALLENGE CLASS ENTRY – Only one entry is allowed per exhibitor in each challenge class with the exception of the Hybridizer Challenge Class.

Exhibitors in Classes 1, 11 & 17 must reside in the South Central District.

STAGING - Classes 1 thru 10 will be staged on low tables. All other classes will be staged on tables of standard height.

JUDGING – Specimens will be judged based on the following scale of points:

Form	25	Stem and Foliage	20
Color	20	Balance and Proportion	10
Substance	15	Size	10



SOUTH CENTRAL DISTRICT ROSE SHOW LARGE CHALLENGE CLASSES

CLASS ARS ROSEDALE BOWL COMPETITIVE CLASS

SIX (6) HYBRIS TEAS, not more than two (2) of one variety, correctly named and exhibited in separate containers.

1. It shall be placed in competition once each year at a District show or one of the larger shows held by and affiliated chapter/club.
2. The Bowl should not be competed for at the same show where the Nicholson Perpetual Challenge Bowl is in competition.
3. The Rosedale Bowl shall be competed for in a special class known as the Rosedale Bowl competitive class **open only to members of the American Rose Society (not just the District).**
4. The winner shall be entitled to keep the trophy in his or her possession until requested by the Executive Director of the American Rose Society to then send it to the place of the next competition. Under normal circumstances the Bowl will be in the possession of each winner nine or more months.

The Prizes and Awards Committee of the American Rose Society shall approve the specifications of the Rosedale Bowl Competitive Class for each show where it is to be awarded, and the approved wording shall appear in the published schedule of the show.

Where there are less than three (3) entries in any American Rose Society trophy class, the class shall not be judged, unless, in the opinion of the judges, the exhibit is outstanding and merits the honor.

FIVE (5) HYBRID TEAS, each a different variety, one bloom per stem, no sidebuds, at exhibition stage, in separate containers.

THREE (3) SHRUB ROSES, each a different variety, one bloom per stem and/or sprays displayed in separate containers.

CLASS 8 STANDARD STAGES OF BLOOM

THREE (3) HYBRID TEAS or GRANDIFLORAS, each of the same variety, one bloom per stem, in different stages of bloom, displayed in separate containers. Stages to be: one bloom 1/4 to 1/3 open, one bloom at exhibition stage and one bloom fully open (stamens must show).

PHOTOGRAPHY CHALLENGE

General Rules

This class is open to all amateur photographers only. All photographs will be 8 x 10 inch color photographs of a rose or group of roses. Photo must be mounted in a picture frame provided by the SCD. Entry tag should include the rose variety, if known. Photographs will be judged 100% on photographic excellence. Exhibitors may enter up to ten entries per class.

CLASS 49 “Rose Garden View”

A color photograph of a rose garden, with or without people.

The picture may be in either horizontal or vertical format.

CLASS 50 “A Beautiful Rose”

A color photograph of a rose bloom, spray, or sprays. Some stem and foliage or other objects may be in the composition, but the rose bloom must be dominate in the photo.
